Born in Iowa and raised in South Dakota, Alice had big dreams that were fulfilled when she arrived in San Francisco and played a key role in opening up the Financial District to women. She says she had no real plan, just a sense that she would succeed and that she did by becoming Vice President at Dean Witter working directly with Dean's brother Jack. Alice was a long standing beloved member of the Sausalito Woman's Club and many organizations devoted to the arts. We will miss her wonderful presence on the Board and in our Village! Age Friendly Sausalito Task Force Unveiled Community Action Plan November 29th City Council Meeting



Over the last three and a half years, the Age Friendly Sausalito Task Force (AFSTF) worked hard to create a plan for the future of Sausalito that would incorporate changes to make our City more inclusive and accessible to everyone. Using guidelines set forth by the World Health Organization, the Task Force created a survey that was mailed to every resident 55 and older with the intent of assessing the needs, hopes and ideas of the aging community.

50% of the residents responded to the survey providing a deep reservoir of information, which along with interviews of stakeholders and reviews of existing reports helped in creating the Age Friendly Sausalito Community Action Plan.

You spoke and we listened!

Several ideas in the plan have already been put into action - this has not been a group that has let grass grow under their feet. Both CARSS (Call A Ride for Sausalito Seniors) and the Pedestrian Flag Program evolved because of the work on the Plan.

Initial energy went into these two areas because crosswalks and transportation around town were two of the three top priorities that emerged from the baseline assessment. Housing was the third - both the cost of rental housing and the cost of home modifications/permits. Soon to be released - a Home Modification Guide for senior homeowners and renters.

In the coming months, the Task Force will be making a shorter Executive Summary available to all. Stay tuned for a community-wide meeting to discuss the many opportunities to join in the implementation of the plan.

CREATING A WORLD WHERE WOMEN AND GIRLS MATTER

Rising International Global Holiday Marketplace (article shared by SV Volunteer and SWC Member Sherrie Faber)



On Saturday December 10th, the Sausalito Woman's Club will be open to the public and transformed into a stunning global marketplace. Holiday shoppers will find unique and meaningful gifts handcrafted by women survivors of war, extreme poverty, gender-based violence and human trafficking. Fairly traded jewelry, fashion accessories and home décor from over 20 impoverished countries will be featured.

Marketplace products are made possible by Rising International's women's economic development programs. Rising International is a non-profit that searches the globe for the world's most forgotten women, and empowers them to change their destinies through micro-enterprise.

Countries represented in the marketplace include D.R. Congo where violence against women is used as a war tactic; Pakistan where learning to read or write could cost a woman her life; Guatemala where Mayan girls are the most illiterate population in all of Latin America, and India where the Global Slavery Index indicates there are more women and girls held as slaves than any other country in the world.

In addition to the vast array of globally made products, Rising International will be spotlighting its first American made product, the Safe and Sound bracelet. The bracelet, made out of safety pins, is handcrafted primarily by foster youth who according to the National Center for Mission and Exploited Children are the most vulnerable to local human trafficking. In 2015, one in five

endangered runaways reported were likely sex trafficking victims. 74% of these likely sex trafficking victims were in the care of social services or foster care when they went missing. Co-founded and developed by a local trafficking survivor, the Safe and Sound Program uniquely combines an earned income opportunity with entrepreneurial skill building and trafficking prevention training. Program participants learn the business of jewelry making, earn stipends from creating the Safe and Sound bracelet, and learn to keep themselves and others safe from potential exploiters.

Rising International's vision is to create a world where everyone, including women and girls, has the chance to prosper and live their dreams. The Sausalito Woman's Club also believes in and participates in the fulfillment of dreams.

The Sausalito Woman's Club Scholarship Recognition Fund is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit that provides financial support, encouragement and acknowledgement to deserving students from Sausalito and Marin City who are seeking higher education. In June 2016 the SWC Scholarship Recognition Fund awarded \$65,000 in educational scholarships to thirty-seven deserving students and it looks forward to awarding a similar amount, or more, in June 2017 and mark the end of its 60th anniversary by having given out over one million dollars in scholarships since its founding in 1956. Supported solely through community fundraising and individual donations, as well as commemorative and memorial gifts, while not a sponsor of this event, The SWC Scholarship Recognition Fund will be accepting donations on Friday and Saturday that will be used to fund future scholarships so deserving local students can achieve their higher education dreams.

Rising International's founder and executive director, Carmel Jud, will be a featured speaker at this event. African songstress, Adama Abe will share stories of the life she left in Cameroon, Africa.

For a suggested donation, event attendees can bring or buy gifts to be wrapped by Sausalito Women's Club volunteers. Proceeds will benefit the Sausalito Woman's Club Scholarship Program by funding local scholarships to be awarded in June of 2017.

Marketplace shoppers will also enjoy complimentary refreshments and door prizes. Admission is free.
