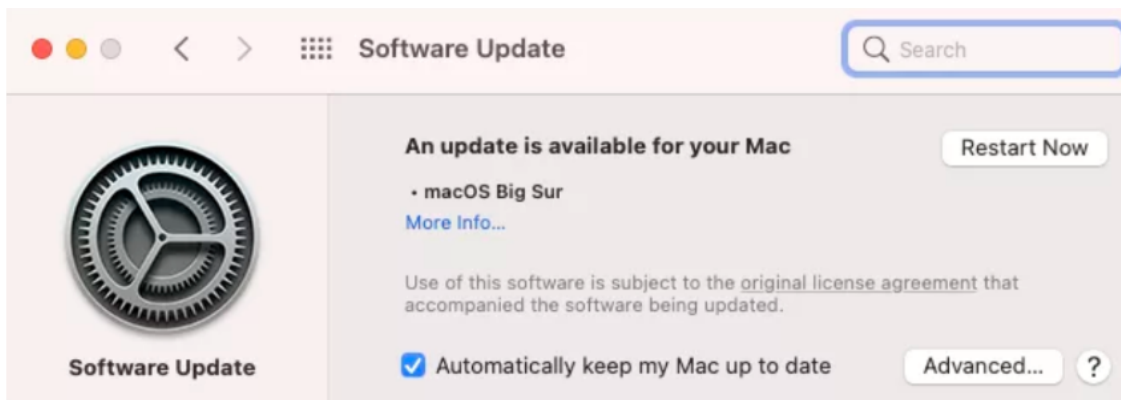

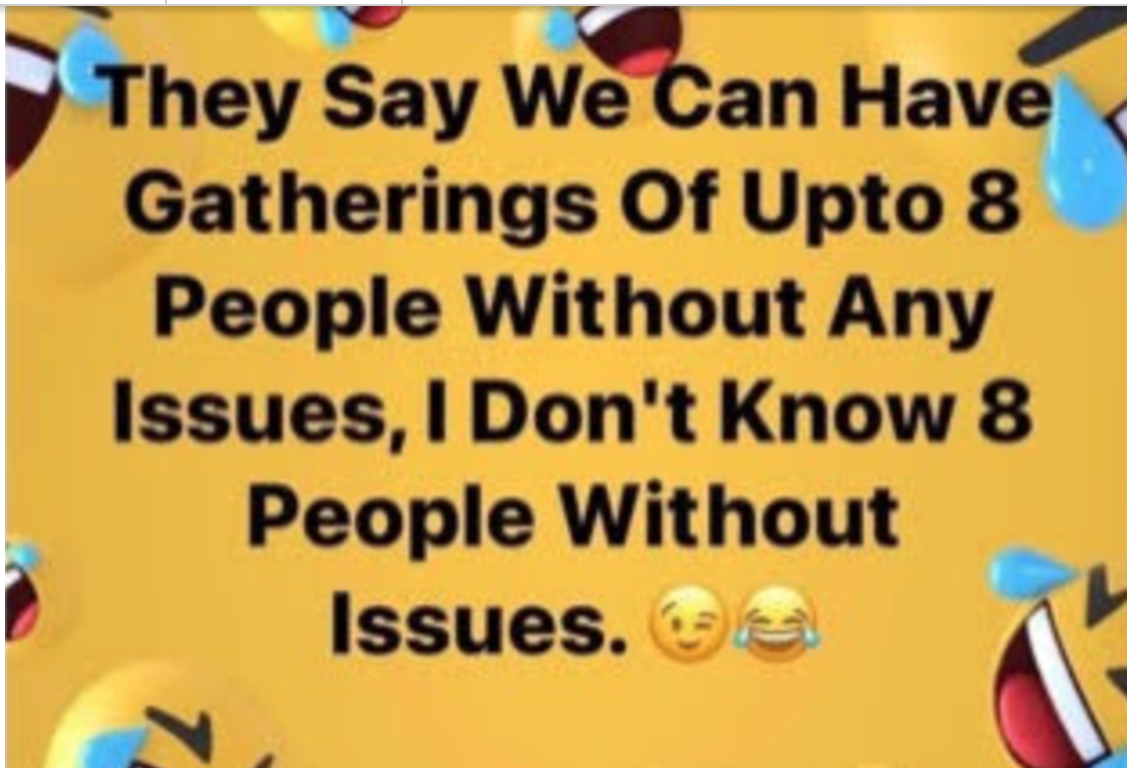
What the World Might Look Like in 250 Million Years
