4th Annual SV Art Show and Opening Art, Authors, Music Bigger and Better Than EVER!



Reaffirming Sausalito's stature as a center and fount of creativity, Sausalito Village hosts an annual art show, featuring the works of Sausalito's graphic artists, writers and a full range of the talent that has made our town unique since its earliest beginnings and continues to vitalize the creative spirit of Sausalito.

The 4th Annual Art Show, sponsored by Sausalito Village will be bigger and better than ever. Held in the past in the City Hall Council Chambers, this year's show will be mounted in the Sausalito Library, a much larger and more accessible space, starting on October 23 and running through December 4.

Recognizing that the show has outgrown its original Council Chambers space and in order to accommodate visitors with a more accessible time line, Chief Librarian Abbot Chambers has generously allocated the library space for the span of the exhibit.

Thanks to Abbot's generosity, the show will be available for viewing whenever the library is open. Besides the regular hours, Abbot will keep the library open for the Art Show's grand opening.

The opening celebration of the Sausalito Village Art Show will take place at the Library from 6 to 8 p.m. on Sunday, October 30th. Co-chaired by Joyce Alexander, Tricia Smith and Karen Moeller, the event will include food, wine, art, books and music provided by John Imholz, all free. All are welcome to attend. The Art Show is co-chaired by acclaimed Sausalito artists Hillair Bell and Michael Sheets. Betsy Stroman, author of a book on the Sausalito Library's genesis and history, A Place of Innocent Recreations, as well as a biography of Jean Varda, is chairing the authors' event at the opening. Local authors will be asked to participate in the opening celebration and will be responsible for displaying and selling their own books. It's an opportunity to experience some relief from the normal routine though socializing, activities, and a little independence.

We always get together on Tuesdays in the late morning for a couple of hours, and we alternate locations between San Francisco, Marin and the East Bay.
