



## **Marin Transit Fare Promotions**

#### Fare Promotions starting in October!

In August 2021, Marin Transit Board approved a series of fare promotional and pilot programs that will be offered near term, on Marin Transit local service. The goal of these programs is to expand fare assistance programs to provide discounted fares to those who may find fares as a barrier to use transit, offer a post-pandemic relief and promote return to transit. These programs are:

**Free rides on local fixed route service countywide for older adults age 65+ and persons with disabilities**. This will be a 6-month pilot from October 2021 through March 2022. Demand response services (paratransit, Catch-A-Ride, Dial-A-Ride, and Connect) will be exempt from the free fare offerings.

**Free transit passes to the families of low-income students who qualify for free and reduced lunch program**. This offering would provide free transit access to low-income riders in the form of three free one-month passes to eligible families in Nov 2021. Interested riders are able to opt-in for this program through the Youth Pass application process by completing the Youth Pass Income form that can be returned to the school coordinators by Oct 15, 2021. **Free Summer Pass for students in the summer of 2022** that will be valid on local Marin Transit buses. Passes cannot be used on Golden Gate Transit routes.


