

This survey will help the staff and consultant's to draft goals and policies that reflect the priorities, concerns and needs of Sausalito residents.

Older Singles Have Found a New Way to Partner Up: Living Apart


Fearing that a romantic attachment in later life will lead to full-time caregiving, many couples are choosing commitment without sharing a home.

These older adults are seeking (and finding) love, emotional support and an antidote to loneliness. But many older women, in particular, fear that a romantic attachment in later life will shortly lead to full-time caregiving. To avoid this role, some seek to meet their social needs solely from their relationships with family members and friends. Margaret Widuckel, a widowed nurse, 75, from Melbourne, Australia, said she sometimes misses having an intimate partner but fears she'd

about what the doctor said or didn't say."

As researchers study those who do partner, however, they find that increasing numbers are choosing a kind of relationship known as LAT <u>a</u>(rhymes with cat), for "living apart together." These are long-term committed romantic relationships without sharing (or intending to share) a home.

France is the most visited country in the world. Here's why



You might think a large country like the United States is the most visited in the world, but you'd be wrong — France takes that honor.

About 90 million international visitors traveled there in 2019, and tourism makes up 8% of the country's gross domestic product, according to the French ministry of foreign affairs. As with other countries, tourist numbers plunged during the coronavirus pandemic and revenue from visitors to France was cut in half over the first seven months of 2020.

Like the United States, France has mountains, wineries, famous sights and dramatic coastlines in abundance, with a wine-making heritage thought to be thousands of years old. (Spain ranks second for tourist numbers, with 83.5 million in 2019, followed by the United States, with 79.3 million, according to the World Tourism Organization).

On top of that, France is easily accessible from neighboring European countries, is relatively small and has a certain "je ne sais quoi" — something

CARSS is managed by Sausalito Village with one goal in mind – to keep older residents connected to the community and safe as they age.

CARSS provides:

- Free Rides around Sausalito and Marin City.
 Volunteers can also do errands.
- Service available Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 10am-2pm.
- Schedule a Ride/Errand a day ahead or the same day. Need a ride at other times or days just call 48 hours before.
- Rides/Errands provided by vetted volunteers with their cars.
- · Masks and proof of vaccination are required.

Putin is the New Haman....Putintaschen!

Purim celebrates the clear-cut triumph of good over evil—a time-honored tradition among Jewish holidays. The story goes that in Persia during the fifth century B.C.E., an enemy of the Jews, Haman, aims to wipe out the entire people. Queen Esther, married to the king, Ahasuerus, saves her people with the help of her Uncle Mordecai, and Haman is hanged on the gallows he built for Mordecai.

Considered one of the minor Jewish holidays, the festival began on March 16, and continued through the next day. Among Eastern European—Ashkenazi—Jews, a favorite Purim treat is the triangular cookie called a hamantasch (the plural in Yiddish is hamantaschen), which literally means "Haman's pocket," named for the villain in the story.

This year, with Russian despot Vladimir Putin dominating the headlines as the world's cruelest new bad guy, apparently aiming to annihilate and/or subjugate the brave people of Ukraine, renaming the cookies *putintaschen* seems almost too complimentary—they're delicious. He certainly isn't. But the cookies get demolished rather quickly. We can only hope for the same end for the wannabe Russian czar.
