
There are all levels of jobs but each and every one is important to keeping our volunteer-run organization running and thriving.


WEEKLY RESTORATIVE MOVEMENT

Your Grab 'N Go Bag

Ready Marin says it should take about 30 minutes to assemble the supplies you'll want in your Grab 'N Go Bag in the event of an emergency. You probably have many of the items you'll need already in the house.

- Wallet with Driver's License and checkbook
- Credit and debit cards
- Cash in small denominations and change for pay telephones
- Prescription medicines
- Eyeglasses and other medical aids
- Cell phone and chargers (electrical charger, car charger, and solar charger)
- Computer or computer backup media with cords (i.e., portable hard drive, USB drive, etc.)
- Emergency Plan contact list with out-of-state contact information
- Copies of current financial accounts
- Safe deposit keys
- Passport
- Family photos/photos stored on CD
- Family heirlooms, jewelry, etc.
- Other

Seniors with mobility or medical issues may have special needs in preparing for an emergency and may need to reach out to others for help getting ready.


