

### **Fire Smart Landscaping for February**

From the UC Master Gardeners

Trees and Shrubs - Consider spacing.

Plant spacing, size control and maintenance are more important than type of plant. We

cannot eliminate fire but we can alter the fire's behavior.

Consider creating separation by increasing spacing between tree canopies while

considering flat vs sloped terrain.

Maintain vertical clearance of at least 3X the shrub's height between

shrub down, or

pruning smaller, easily ignitable tree branches up, or both.

Avoid massing woody shrubs at the base of trees. Consider low-growing, herbaceous plants instead.

Create islands of plants with non-combustible paths to interrupt spread of fire.

# Online Dating Scammers Will Steal Your Heart — and Your Cash

If you're looking for love online, make sure to keep your wallet — if not your heart — under lock and key. Fraud cases are climbing as the number of dating sites and apps — and users — grow. Today there are an estimated 25,000 romance scammers online worldwide, according to one cybersecurity expert. Between 5 percent and 25 percent of online daters could be fakes or scammers, says another.

The Dallas-based Match Group owns a host of dating sites including Tinder, OkCupid, OurTime and Match.com, which is one of the sites alleged scammers used, according to a complaint. Lauren DeFord, the company's senior manager of marketing, said scams are rare and that the firm takes fraud "very seriously." The company's brands are available in more than 42 languages in more than 190 countries, according to its website.

The company reviews every member profile and blocks accounts originating from high-alert countries, those using stolen credit-card numbers and any with "red-flag language" in profiles, the statement said.

Never send money to someone you haven't met in person, and report it if you receive such a request, the statement said. "Those two steps will stop almost every scam in its tracks and help protect the next potential victim."

Perpetrators, meantime, can feign so much charm you'd think they'd kissed the Blarney Stone. Their motivation? "Greed."

At the FTC's Bureau of Consumer Protection, senior attorney Patti Poss says the admonition against sending cash to a stranger also applies to wire transfers, prepaid cards and gift cards. Inevitably a scammer will seek money for things like a hospital or hotel bill, airfare or visa fees, she says.

# Five famous artworks that were accidentally hung upside-down



**BEFAST: the Acronym That Could Save a Life During a Stroke**

 Numbness in the face, arm or leg, particularly on one side of your body

- · Difficulty speaking or understanding others
- Sudden confusion and mental fogginess
- Sudden vision issues in one or both eyes
- · Sudden dizziness, incoordination and trouble walking
- Sudden migraine headache

Signs of a stroke tend to look the same in men and women, but signs can be less intense in women and are often overlooked. In addition to the signs listed above, women may also feel the following symptoms before stroke:

- Fatigue
- Headaches
- Mind fogginess and memory issues
- Nausea and vomiting

#### **B:** Balance problems

Someone is suddenly unable to stay balanced, experiencing dizziness and struggling to walk.

### E: Eyesight problems

Someone suddenly experiences blurry vision and sees double or black.

#### F: Face muscle drooping

One side of the face is dropping and unable to function as normal.

#### A: Arm numbness

One arm suddenly feels numb or weak and cannot be raised simultaneously with the other.

### S: Speech difficulties

Someone is blurring their speech, speaking incoherently or unable to repeat phrases.

### T: Time to call for help

# Before and after: Lake Oroville, California's second-largest reservoir, has risen 182 feet

One of the best places to see how dramatically big storms this winter have changed California's water picture is three hours north of the Bay Area, in the foothills east of Sacramento Valley.

There, Lake Oroville, the second-largest reservoir in California and a key component of the state's water system, has undergone a breathtaking transformation. Sixteen months ago, the reservoir was so parched from severe drought that it was just 22% full. For the first time since it opened in 1967, its power plant had shut down because there wasn't enough water to spin the turbines and generate electricity.

Now Oroville reservoir is 65% full. Since its lowest point on Sept. 30, 2021, the massive lake's level has risen 182 feet, boosted by nine atmospheric river storms in January.


during a visit to survey the biggest Sierra snowpack in nearly 30 years near Lake Tahoe.

But Nemeth and other water leaders say the state was in a deep hole after three years of severe drought, and will need more storms in February and March to fill its biggest reservoirs, like Oroville, and end the drought. Last year, a wet December gave way to a very dry January, February and March, bursting hopes the drought was ending.

"Does our big January actually bust the drought in California? It's too soon to tell," Nemeth said, adding "I don't want to be the downer here. But I do want to make sure that everyone understands that we need to exercise caution."

We asked experts in global health and development to identify and explain likely buzzwords for this year. Here's a list of nine terms — a mix of the new, the familiar and the forgotten, propelled into prominence by major events.

**Polycrisis** - all of our old problems are occurring in a new way.

**Poverty** is certainly not a new word, but the consensus is that poverty is reaching worrying new levels, and this target is now unlikely to be met.

**Traveler surveillance** — testing and gathering data rather than preventing people from entering a country as a way to keep an eye on any potential harmful COVID-19 developments.

**Child wasting** — the most life-threatening form of malnutrition in which a child has very low weight for their height.

"Zero-dose" children are those who had never received any of even the most essential vaccinations —diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus.



# Thursday February 9th 6 PM The Spinnaker

Tappan Wilder has served since 1997 as the literary executor for his uncle Thornton Wilder, the celebrated author who wrote OurTown, The Skin of Our Teeth, The Matchmaker [source of Hello, Dolly!], The Bridge of San Luis Rey and The Eighth Day, to start a list of still enormously successful and internationally known prize-winning plays and novels (not to overlook his operas, firm and non-fiction).

What has it been like managing Thornton Wilder's intellectual property? What was his uncle and his Wilder family like? Drawing on readings by local actors, images and recording clips, Tappan paints a picture of the man he knew as "Uncle Thorny," the writer who wrote his friend Alexander Woollcott in 1938 (and meant it): "What's life if it isn't risk, venture, taxes on the willpower, diversity, and fun?"

Tappan, who has spoken widely about his uncle and contributed background material for the publication of his major works, has lived in Sausalito for ten years.


