


Hand Sanitizer Produced at WaveAdvance on Gate 5 Road available at no cost to our residents through Friday, April 17th.



WaveAdvance, LLC, the Marinship Emergency Medical Manufacturing Group and the Sausalito Working Waterfront Coalition executed on a plan to produce approximately 45 gallons of hand sanitizer to be made available to the residents of Sausalito at no cost. The location is 170 Gate 5 Road (across from the Cibo Bakery outlet). Dispensing of the hand sanitizer will take place from 11-1 pm through Friday, April 17th. Additional days will be added according to availability. Rather than procure hundreds of small plastic bottles, residents are asked to bring a small container with a cap that will be filled by a volunteer with up to 6 ounces of the hand sanitizer.

Ingredients were sourced from several distributors and mixed in compliance with the U.S.Pharmacopoeia Standards. The primary ingredient is 80% ethanol. The hand sanitizer was produced in compliance with the guidelines granted by the FDA for use during the Covid-19 public health emergency.

Aviation museums you can visit online right now




Enjoy your new coworkers
