CARSS Celebrates One Year Anniversary!



There is a great deal to celebrate with the one year anniversary of CARSS (Call A Ride for Sausalito Seniors), a City of Sausalito Age Friendly program managed by SV. CARSS took its inaugural ride on May 6, 2015 with Charlotte Mastrangelo in the passengers seat heading to and from Sausalito Village's Monday morning Chair Yoga class. Since then, the number of rides per month has grown to an

average of 132 with over 30 Volunteer Drivers and 89 Riders signed up.

The program is a unique model for volunteer transportation because it combines the ability to request rides up to one week ahead, but it is the only one in the Country that also allows Same Day Ride requests that go straight to the Driver on Duty during the driver's four hour shift. This all works because of the small geographic area of CARSS which includes the City of Sausalito, the floating homes up to Gate 6 1/2 and Gateway Shopping Center (which will soon include Target as a tenant).

In January, the Washington Post wrote an article entitled "What The Best Cities Will Look Like In 2030" and named New York City and Sausalito as the examples - Sausalito because of CARSS!!

BUT it is really ALL ABOUT THE VOLUNTEERS! Without our dedicated group of Volunteer Drivers, the program would not be a success. Kudos to all of our team who have dedicated a minimum of 4 hours per month to drive one of the CARSS shifts. If you have 4 hours to donate, please consider applying to drive for CARSS.

Darby Is Available For Home Visits!


Jill Johnson is a Volunteer Driver for CARSS and Sausalito Village who happens to be the owner of one of the most adorable dogs in town named Darby.

In Remembrance of Gary Semereaux





"It's a scary and depressing image of aging: If you are sick or poor and over 65, it's your own fault because you didn't do the right things when you were younger. NEW Free Cane Program Coming To Waterstreet Hardware
This Summer



Sausalito Village Board Member, Lois Prentice not only came up with a great idea but partnered with Waterstreet Hardware on Caledonia Street to make it happen this summer - it's a Free Cane Program that is open to all residents of Sausalito and the Floating Homes.

This is how it will work:

IF YOU HAVE A CANE that you no longer need, you will be able to drop it into a barrel that will be clearly marked at the front of the local store.

IF YOU NEED A CANE, temporarily or long term, you will be able to go to Waterstreet and choose one from the barrel. The only catch? You are asked to return the cane when you no longer need it, to keep the program going.

SV MEMBERS ONLY BENEFIT: Sausalito Village members can ask for transportation and one on one assistance in fitting of a cane by contacting the Concierge at 415-332-3325.
