Caregiver Support Group in Sausalito

I was sitting quietly in church several months ago and decided to count the people in our Sausalito congregation who were - like me - caring for a loved one suffering some form of cognitive impairment. I was dismayed to observe that in that small sample of about 40 people 15% were caregivers!

The shock of this made me realize that we could benefit from a Caregiver Support Group in our own community. So, I set about trying to make that happen with the help of two caring professionals who also offered to volunteer their time.

We are grateful and very pleased to announce the first Caregiver Support Group in our community will be held Saturday, August 12. The support group - led by professional, (credentialed) facilitators and serving southern Marin and beyond - will be held the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10am-noon in Campbell Hall next to Christ Episcopal Church. We have also begun the process of affiliating with the Alzheimer's Association of Northern California.

We hope anyone caring for a loved one with a dementia-related illness will join us on August 12, or one of the monthly meetings thereafter. I can personally assure you that the ability to

exchange information, learn about solutions to problems, talk through challenges and ways of coping, share feelings and frustrations, and learn about available resources is invaluable.

Rest assured that you and your situation will be held in complete confidentiality.


