The Dorothea Lange Digital Archive: Explore 600+ Photographs by the Influential Photographer (Plus Negatives, Contact Sheets & More)

Shortly before her death in 1965, one of the New Deal's most famous photographers, <u>Dorothea Lange</u>, spoke at UC Berkeley. "Someone showed me photos of migrant farmworkers they had just taken," she said. "They look just like what I made in the '30s." We can see the same conditions Lange documented almost 60 years later, from the poverty of the Depression to the internment and demonization of immigrants. Only the clothing and the architecture has changed. "Her work could not be more relevant to what's happening today," says Lange biographer Linda Gordon.
